

General tips on Stain removal



- Stains are easiest to remove when fresh.
- Before treating always check the care label on your fabrics and establish whether the fabric is washable or not.
- First make sure that your fabric is color fast. The best way is to test the stain remover on the inside of a seam or hem.
- Treat the stain carefully. Rub gently not vigorously, if necessary only dab or press. Stain removal takes time and patience!
- Work from the outside of the stain inwards, so no edges form.
- After drying the cleaned area lightly brush the fabric to even up the threads.
- If the stain has still not completely disappeared, the treatment can be repeated.

Information on Fabric compatibility

- **White fast fabrics** can usually stand being wet and rubbed and present fewest problems for stain removal. It is often possible to bleach out stubborn stains.
- **White washable fabrics with colored prints** can fade, mark the colored parts, and discolor other items of laundry as a result of too high temperatures, too aggressive washing, pre-treatment and stain products.
- **Colored washable fabrics** need mild products. Bleaching means loss of color.
- **Wool** must be treated very carefully. It cannot stand being rubbed, wrung or pulled. Washing and tumble drying are only possible to a limited extent, and stain removal is difficult.
- **Silk and velvet** are two of the most difficult fabrics. The delicate and expensive material, even washable silk, must be treated extremely carefully.
- **Man-made and mixed fibers need** the manufacturer's instructions to be followed precisely when washing, removing stains and cleaning.

Note particularly

Pre-Wash Concentrated Stain remover

Use: Slant applicator only slightly to a max. 45°C to spray. Spray evenly from a distance. Never rub the sprayed area.

To prevent clouds/rings: Dirt in the air such as dust, soot, exhaust fumes etc, can cause white fabrics to gradually become gray and light fabrics to get darker and darker without you noticing. By treating with Pre-Wash concentrate, the dirt on the treated area is removed without leaving a residue, i.e. the original color of the item is brought back. But only on the areas treated with Pre-Wash. Your item of laundry will regain its original color if you completely spray it with Pre-Wash, wash again as normal, and rinse well. Then even the last remains of dirt and the dark clouds/rings will disappear!



If the item cannot be chemically cleaned (see label with care symbols inside item), it must not be treated with Pre-Wash.

Pre-Wash hygienic rinse

Fungus and bacteria can survive in today's washing temperatures of 30° - 60°C. Simply washing is no longer enough. Germs are particularly good at multiplying in a damp warm environment close to the body. One simple rinse cycle with Pre-Wash hygienic rinse prevents the transfer of germs to other fabrics. Your laundry smells pleasantly fresh and is hygienic again.
